Chair Dowling called the meeting to order at 9:31 AM. Introductions were made.

ITEM 2 PUBLIC COMMENT

Chair Dowling asked if anyone from the public wished to address the Committee. No public comment was received.

APPROVE MINUTES OF THE TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 13, 2016 AND RECEIVE THE POLICY COMMITTEE MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 15, 2016

A motion was made by Mr. Fowler, supported by Vice-Chair Kline, to approve the Technical Advisory Committee meeting minutes of September 13, 2016 and receive the Policy Committee meeting minutes of September 15, 2016. The motion passed unanimously.

ITEM 4 AGENCY STATUS REPORTS

Project status updates were presented by the City of Jackson, Jackson Area Transportation Authority, Jackson County Department of Transportation, Michigan Department of Transportation, Jackson County Airport-Reynolds Field, and the Enterprise Group. Copies of the agency status reports were included in the meeting packet. Some highlighted items:

- City of Jackson The Mechanic St. project is now scheduled to be complete by the end of the month. Kibby Rd. design is ongoing.
- JATA Transit Center refurbishment is now complete and the remaining \$31,000 will be
 used to refurbish the employee break room and outdoor lighting. The rest of the projects
 included in the progress report are on schedule. Ms. Masoud also informed the
 committee that phase two of the transit study will focus on corrections and solutions to
 the customer survey issues from phase one.
- JCDOT Fifth Street project is now ongoing and should be completed by November.
 W. Michigan Ave. bridge is currently being discussed with MDOT Rail and Amtrak. 2017 projects may need to be designed and managed by consultants due to staffing changes.
 Ms. Kline added that a TEDF-A grant will fund the Coats Rd. project, which will be letting in April. Lomar is expanding to a sixth location.
- Several MDOT projects have been updated with work start dates, which has been included in the packet. I-94 projects should be completed in mid-November.
- Jackson County Airport Progress report was included in the packet.
- The Enterprise Group Ms. Torres informed the committee about several projects. The Irish Hills Mall refurbishment, MultiMatic opening, and the new Lomar facility are all moving ahead.

JACTS TRAVEL DEMAND MODEL UPDATE - APPROVAL OF THE 2010/2014 DEMOGRAPHIC DATA AND 2014 EMPLOYMENT DATA

Mr. Kent and Mr. Dawson explained the results of the demographic and employment data collection and how it will be used in the transportation model. Ms. Torres made a motion to approve the results, which was seconded by Vice-Chair Kline and passed unanimously.

Mr. White made a motion to approve the modification as presented, which was seconded by Mr. Rand and passed unanimously. Chair Dowling also noted that a public meeting regarding the design changes will take place next month.

Chair Shotwell called the meeting to order at 8:05 AM. A quorum was present.

ITEM 2 PUBLIC COMMENT

No public comment was received.

APPROVE MINUTES OF THE POLICY COMMITTEE MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 15, 2016 AND RECEIVE THE TECHNICAL ADVISOR

SEPTEMBER 15, 2016 AND RECEIVE THE TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 13, 2016

The motion was made by Mr. Brittain, supported by Vice-Chair Jancek, to approve the Policy Committee meeting minutes of September 15, 2016 and to receive the Technical Advisory Committee meeting minutes of September 13, 2016. The motion carried unanimously.

ITEM 4 AGENCY STATUS REPORTS

Project status updates were reviewed by the City of Jackson, Jackson Area Transportation Authority, Jackson County Department of Transportation, Michigan Department of Transportation, and Jackson County Airport – Reynolds Field. Comments were as follows:

<u>City of Jackson</u> – The Mechanic St. project is now scheduled to be complete by the end of the month. Kibby Rd. design is ongoing.

<u>Jackson Area Transportation Authority</u> – Transit Center refurbishment is now complete and the remaining \$31,000 will be used to refurbish the employee break room and outdoor lighting. The rest of the projects included in the progress report are on schedule.

<u>Jackson County DOT</u> – Fifth Street project is now ongoing and should be completed by November. Mr. Acker raised concerns about the Dearing Rd. project, stating that there are safety issues during construction and that backups are occurring frequently all the way to Sandstone Rd. Mr. Acker stated that there needs to be a backup plan if asphalt cannot be placed before the plant closes. Mr. Wymer requested an update on the Moon Lake Rd. bridge, no further updates are available at this time. A request for funding has been submitted. Mr. Acker raised concerns that Glasgow Rd. needed to be repaired from contractors and trucks damaging the road during the Jackson County Airport project.

<u>MDOT</u> – Mr. Gulock explained that several MDOT projects have been updated with work start dates, which has been included in the packet.

<u>Jackson County Airport</u> – Mr. Feldvary informed the committee that landfill removal is complete, backfill is ongoing. Argyle Rd. and Airport Rd. will be reopened in nine days when work is finished. The restrooms at the airport will also be upgraded.

JACTS 2045 LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN UPDATE - APPROVAL OF THE 2010/2014 DEMOGRAPHIC DATA AND 2014 EMPLOYMENT DATA

Mr. Dawson explained that the base year socioeconomic data review had been completed. MDOT and MPO staff is requesting approval of the data. Chair Shotwell noted that some data did not seem to be correct, stating that rural townships had less than expected employment. Mr. Dawson explained that the data in the report was used for travel analysis, and that most agricultural businesses did not generate commuting traffic. Chair Shotwell raised concerns that if the data was incorrect that it should not be approved, also noting that all businesses in the data review were not confirmed. Mr. Dawson stated that in the urban areas of the county, participants were instructed to review only businesses that generated significant commuting traffic. Mr. Dawson also stated that

the review process was extremely thorough and that MDOT was using it as an example for other areas. Mr. Moilanen made a motion to approve the demographic and employment data as presented, which was seconded by Vice-Chair Jancek and passed unanimously.

Mr. Dawson explained the proposed modification to the Kibby Road project next year. The design of the project was modified to pave only one side of the boulevard and make it a two-way traffic road. The cost of the project will not be modified. Chair Shotwell raised concerns that reducing the level of service and capacity for the road did not make sense. Mr. Brittain asked for Mr. Dawson to explain the modifications and if they were appropriate. Mr. Dawson explained the modifications and stated that it was an appropriate design.

Mr. Gulock explained the two additions of M-60 Right-Of-Way phase projects for MDOT. These items were dropped from the FY 2014-2017 TIP and needed to be added for construction phases in 2017 and 2022.

Mr. Brittain made a motion to approve the modification and amendments as presented, which was seconded by Vice-Chair Jancek and passed unanimously.

<u>Kibby Road: City Limits to West Ave (Urban)</u> - Reconstruct pavement on south side of boulevard islands, roundabout at Denton and non-motorized path from City limits to Denton. MSG is the City's consultant. **Programming has been submitted and we will be requesting a GI soon.**

2018

<u>Fourth Street: Horton to Audubon (Urban)</u> – Roadway resurfacing with a new roundabout at Hickory and Fourth. MSG is the City's consultant. Survey is complete with design starting.

2019

<u>Francis Street: Morrell to Mason (Urban)</u> – Reconstruct roadway. No design work at this time.

2020

<u>Greenwood/Wilkins Streets: Morrell to Jackson (Urban)</u> – Reconstruct roadway. No design work at this time.

Dear Mr. Duke and Mr. Dawson:

I am providing this correspondence as an update regarding the Jackson Area Comprehensive Transportation Study (JACTS) travel demand model being used for the 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan. This is intended to serve as a substitute for the update that would have been provided in person at the next scheduled JACTS Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) meeting on November 8 since I am unable to attend, due to the observed Election Day state holiday.

The JACTS TAC recommended approval of the travel demand model base year 2014 socioeconomic data at the October 2016 meeting. This data includes population, household, income, and employment data at the Traffic Analysis Zone level. The data is used in trip generation, which is the first step in the traditional four-step travel demand model process. Specifically, population and household data is used to derive trip productions in each zone, while employment data is used to determine trip attractions.

Final preparations are currently underway prior to beginning the base year trip generation process. Some of these steps include assigning area type classifications to each model road network link, data review, reasonableness checking, as well as other tasks. Once completed, it is anticipated that the base year four-step modeling process will continue for the duration of 2016 and into early 2017.

In mid-to-late February 2017, the horizon year (2045) and interim future year (2025 and 2035) socioeconomic data will be made available for local agency review. Furthermore, future year road network data will need to be obtained from local road agencies and entered into the travel demand model for future year modeled trips. The JACTS TAC is expected to receive the future year socioeconomic data in early spring of 2017 and the data will be considered for approval by the committee at the April meeting.
