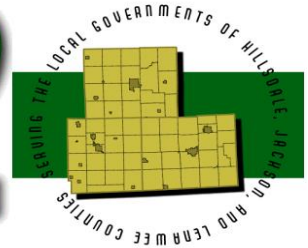


Region 2 Planning Commission



FUNDING:

The Jackson Traffic Safety Program is funded by additional court costs on traffic tickets through the 12th District Court. These funds were dedicated to the Jackson Traffic Safety Program on January 1, 1993.

HOW TO APPLY:

Because of the continued decline in revenue, a maximum grant amount is not being stated. A local match is required. Currently, the match is 15% of the total cost for law enforcement agencies and 35% for non-law enforcement. Providing a higher match may allow more projects to be funded.

Grant requests must promote traffic safety goals as follows:

- A. Increase Occupant Protection**
- B. Reduce Incidents of Impaired and Distracted Driving**
- C. Reduce Traffic Crashes**
- D. Provide Traffic Safety Education/Training Programs**
- E. Promote/Encourage Cooperative Effort**

Projects may include seat belt enforcement, impaired driving patrols, educational programs, and other programs that meet the goals of the program.

As stated above, funding for the Jackson Traffic Safety Program has declined significantly in the last few years. It is imperative that you include detailed information on your grant application in regards to how this money is going to improve traffic safety issues in your area specifically to the above goals.

Eligible agencies include:

- Law Enforcement
- Schools
- Health Departments
- Governmental Agencies
- Non-Profit Associations

Applications are due **Friday, MARCH 30, 2018** for projects to be funded in 2018 (June 1, 2018 to December 31, 2018).
