I. **Call to Order** – Chair Tillotson called the meeting to order at 2:02 p.m. A quorum was present.

- II. **Pledge of Allegiance** Those in attendance joined in the Pledge of Allegiance.
- III. Approval of the Agenda A motion was made by Comm. Beeker, supported by Comm. Driskill, to approve the February 13, 2020, Executive Committee agenda as presented. The motion carried unanimously.
- IV. Public Comment Chair Tillotson announced the first opportunity for public comment. No public comments were received.

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- V. Approval of Minutes of the December 12, 2019, Executive Committee Meeting A motion was made by Comm. Jancek, supported by Comm. Grabert, to approve the December 12, 2019, Executive Committee meeting minutes as presented. The motion carried unanimously.
- VI. **Receipt of the Treasurer's Report of January 31, 2020** A motion was made by Comm. Drake, supported by Comm. Knoblauch, to approve receipt of the R2PC Treasurer's Report for January 31, 2020. The motion carried unanimously.
- VII. Approval of the February 13, 2020, Submitted Bills A motion was made by Comm. Driskill, supported by Comm. Grabert, to approve payment of the February 13, 2020, submitted bills as presented. The motion carried unanimously.
- VIII. **Staff Progress Report for January, 2020** Mr. Duke highlighted staff activities for January, 2020, as follows:
 - Staff created a series of land use maps for Hillsdale County and a map of major community facilities in the county.
 - Staff met with Toole Design regarding the RPI rural mobility study.
 - The R2PC FY 2019 Annual audit was completed and will be presented at the March meeting.
 - Staff set the 3-County Rural Task Force selection committee meeting for February 25 at JCDOT in Jackson.
 - Staff prepared and submitted the year-end final acceptance report summarizing FY 2019 urban and rural project activities.
 - Staff attended the quarterly I-94 Corridor Alignment Review Team (CART) meeting to review progress on the Cooper Street interchange and Grand River bridge reconstruction. The M-60 interchange reconstruction is set to begin in March. Upcoming I-94 projects beginning in FY 2021 include reconstruction of the West Avenue and Elm Rod interchanges and the Lansing Avenue bridge over I-94.
 - Staff facilitated the process of updating recreation plans in Jackson County and the City of Jackson and provided data to Lenawee County (which is updating its plan inhouse).
 - Staff prepared a proposal to develop a recreation plan for a 14-community multijurisdictional area in southeast Jackson County continuing into Lenawee County.
- IX. Report of Nominating Committee Election of R2PC Officers for 2020 Mr. Duke reported that Section VII of the R2PC bylaws specifies that the four (4) officer positions (Chair, Vice-Chair, Treasurer, and Secretary) shall be elected by the Executive Committee from its membership. Officers shall not serve more than 2 years and are to be rotated among Committee members representing Hillsdale, Jackson, and Lenawee counties. All current officers have served the maximum two years in their positions.

The Nominating Committee met on January 6, 2020 and unanimously endorsed the following slate of officers for 2020 – Chair, Doug Terry (Hillsdale County); Vice-Chair Pete Jancek (Jackson County); Treasurer, Alan Beeker (Hillsdale County); and Secretary, Chris Wittenbach, (Lenawee County). No nominations from the floor were received.

The motion was made by Comm. Elwell, supported by Comm. Duckham, to close nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for the 2020 slate of officers as submitted by the Nominating Committee. The motion carried unanimously.

- X. **Update Economic Development Partnership of Hillsdale County** Ms. Susan Smith, CEO of the Hillsdale County EDP, summarized various programs and projects her agency is working on including developing a leadership foundation, assisting MEDC with an agricultural summit, and continuing retention visits with employers throughout the county.
- XI. MDOT Project Updates Mr. Kelby Wallace, MDOT-Jackson TSC, provided handouts and a PowerPoint presentation reviewing the status of the MDOT projects in Hillsdale and Lenawee counties programmed for 2020-2021. He also reviewed the status of the I-94/Cooper Street interchange and the Grand River bridge reconstruction. I-94 projects programmed for FY 2021-2023 include the reconstruction of both the West Avenue and Elm Road interchanges, and the replacement of the Lansing Avenue bridge.
- XII. Approval of Amendments to the JACTS FY 2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) – Mr. Wallace, MDOT-Jackson TSC, presented the following proposed MDOT amendments:

The report was presented to the R2PC Board and is posted on the www.region2planning.com website.
- XIV. Hillsdale County Existing Land Use Patterns and Major Community Facilities Mr. Bauman reported that a goal of the R2PC 2017-2021 edition is the identification and mapping of cultural and recreational resources. A summary of these resources and locational maps were included in the agenda packet. Similar information for Jackson and Lenawee counties will be available soon.
- XV. **Other Business** Mr. Bauman prepared a summary of bills that have been introduced during the 2019-2020 legislative sessions of the Michigan House of Representatives and the Michigan Senate that would amend the Michigan Zoning Enabling Act. Comm. Terry requested the information be emailed to all members.

Mr. Duke reported that the New Commission orientation session will be held at 1:00 pm prior to the regular R2PC Commission meeting on March 12th.

The Committee thanked Chair Tillotson for his guidance over the past two years of his chairmanship.

Staff Progress Report March, 2020

Area-Wide Regional Planning Activities

Economic Development Activities

- Economic Development Administration (EDA). Staff was involved in the following activities on behalf of the R2PC Economic Development District (EDD):
 - Adapted the series of existing land use maps and a map of major community facilities in Hillsdale County for use in the City of Hillsdale.
 - Participated in a teleconference regarding a FY 2020 Public Works and Economic Adjustment Assistance (PWEAA 2020) grant application for the proposed County Farm-Springport Corridor Improvement Project on March 20th and provided a letter of support for the project which will enable the development of the Jackson Technology Park North (JTPN) industrial park.
 - Updated <u>www.region2planning.com</u> to consolidate all economic development related resources on the <u>Economic Development</u> webpage (with a link from the <u>Library</u> webpage).
- Downtown Development Authorities (DDAs). Staff attended the monthly meetings of the City of Jackson and Leoni Township DDA committees and provided administrative support to the Leoni Township DDA. Staff assisted the Jackson DDA in updating the authority's by-laws.

Regional Prosperity Initiative

- Program Administration
 - Provided advice and technical assistance to GAAR Grantees.
 - Reviewed match requirements for Ypsilanti Township.
 - Handled MOU revisions for two grantees -- Ypsilanti Township and Fresh Start Coffee House.
 - Revised contract with Region 2 that extends end date to August 31, 2020.

Communications and Engagement

- Secured January meeting materials from Toole Design and distributed to management team.
- Assisted the management team with decision-making concerning grantee request to increase funding.

R2PC Activities

- **R2PC Website.** Staff continued updating <u>www.region2planning.com</u>.
- Staff attended a two-day leadership training workshop sponsored by the Michigan Association of Regions.

Regional Transportation Planning Hillsdale, Jackson, and Lenawee Counties

Program Management

- Rural Task Force. Staff submitted the Rural Task Force monthly progress report to MDOT and participated in the monthly conference call. Staff has been working to obtain the job change forms from the agencies that requested amendments and/or administrative modifications from the meeting that was held earlier this year.
- Rural Task Force. Staff was also asked to update project information in JobNet based on a MDOT Rural Task Force Audit that had taken place.
- Staff has been asked to provide guidance and consultation on a potential TAP grant for a group in Lenawee County. Conversations have taken place, but no formal action has been taken at this time.

Metropolitan Area Transportation Planning Jackson Area Comprehensive Transportation Study

Program Management

- Staff attended the 2021 Pre-Unified Work Program meeting with MDOT to discuss the next year's Unified Work Program activities and budget.
- Staff attended the Jackson Area Transportation Authority's monthly Local Transit Advisory Council (LTAC) meeting.

Technical Assistance

- Staff wrote support letters for the Jackson Area Transportation Authority as they are pursuing three Federal Transit Agency grants: 1) for two 35 foot buses; 2) for five bus hoists that are used to repair and maintain buses at JATA's maintenance facility; and 3) to provide funds for two parking lot resurfacing projects – one at the administrative and maintenance facility buildings and the other at the downtown transfer center.
- Staff attended the monthly Active Jackson meeting and provided administrative services for the group.
- Staff is participating in a Safe Routes to School potential project between Lumen Christi High School and Dibble Elementary School near Robinson Road.

City of Jackson and Jackson County Non-Motorized Plan: The Project Steering Committee met to review the final draft plan, and provided insightful comments and edits. A video conference meeting was also held to help the new City of Jackson Interim City Manager and staff get updated on the project. The consultant team is working to update the final draft plan based on these meetings. Upon completion, project stakeholders and members of the public will be invited to review and provide comments on the final draft plan. An email announcing that the project is open for a public review and comment period will follow from staff. Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

- Several amendments were approved by the JACTS committees to the FY 2020-2023 TIP.
- Staff monitored and updated JobNet as necessary.

Jackson Traffic Safety Program

Staff attended the 2020 Michigan Traffic Safety Summit held in East Lansing.

Local Planning Assistance

The requests of member units of government within Hillsdale, Jackson, and Lenawee Counties are listed below. These activities were prepared at cost to the individual units of government requesting the service (unless alternative funding was available).

Hillsdale County

City of Hillsdale. Staff provided the following service(s):

Zoning Ordinance Update. Adapted the series of existing land use maps and a map of major community facilities (along with an accompanying analysis) covering Hillsdale County for use in the City of Hillsdale.

Somerset Township. Staff provided the following service(s):

Zoning Ordinance Update. Met telephonically with the Planning Commission on March 17th to discuss the zoning ordinance text as proposed for an all-encompassing reorganization. Made substantial changes to the proposed update, including the consolidation of some zoning districts, based upon that discussion and detailed notes provided by the Chair. Provided a summary of the proposed changes for use by the Township Clerk in preparing the notice of public hearing.

Jackson County

Village of Brooklyn. Staff provided the following service(s):

Zoning Ordinance Update. Spoke with the MEDC (Michigan Economic Development Corporation) regarding progress on the zoning ordinance update.

County of Jackson. Staff provided the following service(s):

- County Planning Commission (JCPC). Facilitated the March 12th JCPC meeting and summarized the staff analysis and advisements concerning: (1) the proposed rezoning of the Sentry Self Storage Facility along McDevitt Avenue in Summit Township to the more appropriate 'highway service commercial (C-3)' and the vacant portion of an adjacent residential lot to the same zoning in order to facilitate the expansion of the storage facility; (2) the proposed 'office (O-1)' rezoning of properties at the intersection of Spring Arbor and Robinson Roads in Summit Township; and (3) a Farmland and Open Space Preservation Agreement (PA 116) application for properties located on the north side of the Village of Hanover in Hanover Township. Cover letters and associated documentation, including meeting minutes, were subsequently sent to the municipalities regarding the recommendations made by the JCPC. The minutes were also posted on the JCPC webpage of the R2PC website.
- Jackson City + County Nonmotorized Plan. Attended the March 7th meeting of the Steering Committee at which the full draft of the nonmotorized plan was summarized and a March 18th telephonic meeting with new and interested officials from the City of Jackson regarding the proposed plan. Referenced the proposed plan in an endorsement letter for a grant application which would fund improvements to the County Farm/Springport Road Corridor, including nonmotorized facilities.

Village of Springport. Staff provided the following service(s):

Master Plan Update. Spoke with the MEDC (Michigan Economic Development Corporation) regarding progress on the master plan update.

Lenawee County

Village of Addison. Staff provided the following service(s):

- Zoning. Aided the Mayor in reconciling the Village's existing medical marihuana zoning provisions with proposed recreational marihuana zoning provisions.
- Planning Commission. Discussed with the Mayor how a public hearing before the Planning Commission could be held telephonically in light of COVID-19 and Governor Whitmer's Executive Order regarding Michigan's Open Meetings Act.

County of Lenawee. Staff provided the following service(s):

County Planning Commission (JCPC). Cancelled the March 19th LCPC meeting due to COVID-19 and the closure of the R2PC office. Prepared staff analysis and advisements to pertinent communities concerning: (1) text amendments to Chapter 36 (Zoning) of the *Code of Ordinances of Cambridge Township* regarding 'Medical Marihuana Facilities and Recreational Marihuana Establishments'; (2) text amendments to the *Raisin Charter Township Zoning Ordinance* regarding the 'Zoning Board of Appeals'; and (3) Farmland and Open Space Preservation Agreement (PA 116) applications for properties located in Adrian and Madison Townships. Cover letters and associated documentation were subsequently sent to the municipalities regarding the recommendations.

Raisin Township. Staff provided the following service(s):

Master Plan. Analyzed the 314 responses to the community survey conducted for the Township's new master plan (currently under development). A couple versions of the analysis were prepared and sent to the Township Supervisor for distribution to the Planning Commission. The first version analyses the responses of all participants in the survey. The second version compares the responses of those participants who were 45 years old and younger with the responses of all participants. This was done because of the advanced age of the majority of respondents.

This letter is sent by the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) to inform the Jackson Area Comprehensive Transportation Study committees of several TIP amendments to the FY 2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP).

Achieve the objectives in the Executive Directive 2019 - 14 – "to ensure full implementation of the DAP [Michigan Domestic Action Plan] and its objectives, including the objective of reducing the nutrient loadings from the following tributaries and priority watersheds by 40% by 2025." This will be a pilot project that is intended to demonstrate methods that reduce nutrient runoff that cause harmful algal blooms in Lake Erie.

A property and willing seller have not yet been identified; however, the land acquired will support a wetland restoration 30-80 acres in size.
