

 - Introduce "Alter Egos"


Do you have any idea what college tuition costs these days? I can barely afford shoes let alone a car. All I can afford to do is walk and bike.

- Online survey and map stayed open through the end of May to collect any additional input

How Does This Impact the Plan?

- 70% of "placemaking" is recognizing what you have and not screwing it up
- These are the characteristics that the community treasures and that should be highlighted and linked
- Community wayfinding can be integrated with interpretive "trails" and Jackson has some great stories to tell





Think of a favorite city that you visit – odds are it has a distinctive vibe that sets it apart form other places

Jackson does not need to invent an image – it just need to celebrate what it already has




Jackson City County Nonmotorized Plan







Geographic Distribution




Every township represented except Norvell Twp.



How would you rate your satisfaction with walking in Jackson County right now (circle one):



Walking – Desired Destinations







- 93% of respondents are interested in walking for fitness and/or recreation
- Transportation trips are focused on travel to the store, restaurants, and errands.
- Minimal interest in walking to work (probably a distance issue or don't work)



Walking – Issues Preventing Walking Trips




- Maintenance/condition of existing sidewalks poor/narrow/uneven (Jackson, Grass Lake, Brooklyn)
- Lack of sidewalks or paved shoulder (outside of downtowns, Lake Columbia, Brooklyn, Spring Arbor, Leoni Twp, Summit Twp)
- Lighting and personal safety
- Snow ice removal
- Drivers paying attention
- Lack of crosswalks



Bicycling – Current Satisfaction

How would you rate your satisfaction with riding a bicycle in Jackson County right now (circle one):







- Similar to walking
- It is okay, but could be better



Bicycling – Desired Destinations







- Very similar distribution curve as desired pedestrian destinations but higher percentages likely due to what is within biking distance
- Bike to work almost doubles to 31%
- Visit Family and Friends almost doubles to 40%
- 91% want to bike for fitness / recreation



Bicycling – Issues Preventing Bicycling Trips

- Pavement condition (pot holes, debris)
- Availability of safe bikeways
- Driver knowledge and attitudes toward bikes
- Lack of separated bikeways
- Narrow roads / no paved shoulders
- High speed, high traffic roadways
- Bike parking



Transit – Current Satisfaction






 61% are not familiar with the Bus or Train service in the Jackson County

Is anything preventing you from riding the bus or train to those destinations right now? How could we make the experience better?



What Specific Places Would you Like to See Improved?









Detailed maps for Spring Arbor and Grass Lake:

- 27 places for Grass Lake
 - Connections to parks, schools and grocery stores
 - Improve crosswalks
 - Off road trail opportunities
 - Sidewalk gaps
- 15 places for Spring Arbor
 - Connection to schools and market
 - Improve M-60 (sidewalks, crosswalks)
 - Sidewalk gaps



Key Takeaways – Urban and Suburban Areas

- In-street bicycle facilities must be done right – good separation, connected, and well maintained if they are to be used
- Need to take care of the pedestrian basics by filling sidewalk gaps and providing appropriate crosswalks
- We can't address bicycle and pedestrian facilities without addressing poor pavement condition of the roads




There is a latent demand for more and better pedestrian, bicycle, and transit routes and facilities



Key Takeaways – Intercommunity Connections

- There is a can-do attitude for building trails in the rural areas
 - Willing to work with private land owners to make things happen
- The connections do not all have to look like the Falling Water's Trail
 - Natural surface trails
 - Gravel road routes
- Connections are not just between communities in Jackson
 - Look beyond the borders



Use intercommunity trails and routes as a way to explore and celebrate the county's natural areas and rural character

Can be a key part of creating a brand for Jackson County and bringing in visitors



Other Key Takeaways

- Rural on-demand system is not keeping up with demand - need some new approaches
- Limited service hours is the biggest limitation of the fixed route transit system
- Need to provide pedestrian and bicycle linkages in the suburban fringe areas
- The City of Jackson appears to be less engaged in this effort than many of the other communities



There was not an urban/rural dichotomy in the demand for pedestrian, bicycle, and transit routes and facilities



- Develop the preliminary systems plan over the summer
- Then another round of public input in the fall to get input on the preliminary systems plan
