### Staff Progress Report December 2020

### Area-Wide Regional Planning Activities

#### **Economic Development Activities**

- **Economic Development Administration (EDA).** Staff was involved in the following activities on behalf of the R2PC Economic Development District (EDD):
  - Noncompetitive EDD (Economic Development District) CARES (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security) Act supplemental grant award to address the economic consequences of the COVID-19 Pandemic. The \$351,183 award will fund the launching of an easy-to-use website that will serve as a resource for local businesses, the hiring of a disaster recovery coordinator, and the implementation of other CEDS goals.
    - The Michigan Manufacturing Technology Center (MMTC) has started building the CARES Act website platform.
    - Participated in the Michigan Department of Treasury / Michigan Municipal League "COVID-19 Updates and Resources for Local Governments" webinar on December 8.
  - Continued background research and analysis in anticipation of approval of R2PC EDD's
    application for \$70,000 in EDA funds for FY 2021 Partnership Planning Assistance, which will be
    used to write the 2021-2025 edition of the Region 2 Economic Development District
    Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS).
- **Downtown Development Authorities (DDAs).** Staff attended the monthly meetings of the City of Jackson and Leoni Downtown Development Authorities.
  - Presented a proposal from R2PC to the Leoni Township Downtown Development Authority to develop a Downtown Master Plan for the DDA at their December 2 meeting.

#### **R2PC Activities**

- **R2PC Website.** Staff continued updating www.region2planning.com.
- Michigan Climate Leadership Activator. Staff attended the December 3, 9, and 17 sessions of the webinar sponsored by Michigan's Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE).
- Staff spoke with a staff member from the Michigan Department of Treasury regarding future funding opportunities available to the state's regional planning agencies.

#### [December, 2020 Staff Progress Report]

#### Regional Transportation Planning Hillsdale, Jackson, and Lenawee Counties

#### **Program Management**

- **Rural Task Force.** Staff submitted the Rural Task Force monthly progress report to MDOT and participated in the monthly conference call.
- Rural Task Force. The Full Region 2 Rural Task Force meeting will be held on Wednesday, January 6, 2021.

#### Metropolitan Area Transportation Planning Jackson Area Comprehensive Transportation Study

#### **Program Management**

- Staff completed the 2020 Obligated Projects report, and posted to the Region 2 Planning Commission website.
- Staff attended the monthly Michigan Transportation Planning Association meeting.
- Staff completed the MDOT quarterly invoices and project narratives for asset management, rural task force planning, regional planning, and JACTS activities.
- Staff attended the Local Transportation Advisory Council (LTAC) meeting.
- Staff conducted meetings of the JACTS Technical Advisory and Policy Committee meetings.

#### **Technical Assistance**

- Staff continues to provide administrative services for the Active Jackson Coalition. Staff attended the monthly meeting.
- Staff continued providing assistance to the group discussing the possibility of a trail study for the Watkins Lake State Park/Brooklyn area. Local governments in the southeastern portion of the county have passed resolutions to financially support a feasibility study for the trail. Jackson County has also been approached to support the study financially. The DNR has also contributed to the project. The Irish Hills Legacy Foundation is taking the lead on the project, and staff will continue to support the project as it moves along.
- City of Jackson and Jackson County Non-Motorized Plan. Staff is continuing to work with the Village of Concord to address their questions about non-motorized facility development in the southwestern portion of the county. In December, staff participated in two meetings with the Village, Jackson County Parks and JCDOT, leaders from Calhoun County, and the DNR. Potential non-motorized routes to provide a connection between southeastern Calhoun County and southwestern Jackson County were discussed. A follow-up meeting is scheduled for January 2021.

#### [December, 2020 Staff Progress Report]



Subject: Climate Change

Staff attended EGLE's (Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy's) Michigan Climate Leadership Activator Series, hosted by the Association of Climate Change Officers (ACCO). Staff learned that the following major U.S. climate trends are pertinent to south-central Lower Michigan:<sup>1</sup>

- **Extreme precipitation.** Heavy downpours are increasing nationally, especially over the last three to five decades. The largest increases are in the Midwest and Northeast.
- Floods. Floods have been increasing in parts of the Midwest and Northeast.
- Cold waves and winter storms. Cold waves have become less frequent and intense across the Nation. Winter storms have increased in frequency and intensity since the 1950s and their tracks have shifted northward.
- Rísing temperatures. [The] U.S. average temperature has increase by 1.3°F to 1.9°F since record keeping began in 1895. Warming has been the greatest in North and West while some parts of the Southeast have experienced little change.
