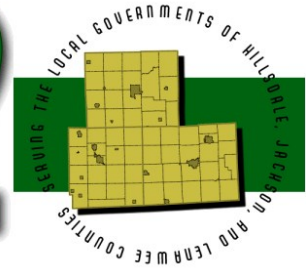

West Avenue Signals at Franklin, Washington and Morrell with Ganson and Elm Signal - Reconstruct Signals on West Ave at Franklin and Morrell with Signal at Ganson and Elm. HRC is the consultant on this project. Final submittal was made on October 22, 2021. **Waiting for MDOT letting.**

Greenwood Ave: Fourth St to Morrell St with Greenwood/Fourth & Fourth/Prospect Signals - Mill and HMA Resurface on Greenwood with signal replacements at the intersections. HRC is the consultant on this project. Final submittal was made on October 22, 2021. **Waiting for MDOT letting.**

Brown Street: Morrell to Michigan – Mill and HMA Relocate curb and construct non-motorized trail on east side. City has sent out Request for Proposals to obtain consultant.

Wildwood Avenue: West Ave to Steward – Mill and HMA Resurface. City has sent out Request for Proposals to obtain consultant.

We would like to provide the following update regarding our projects that are on the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2021, 2022, and 2023.

FY 2021

JN 207171 McCain Road and Robinson Road

Work has been completed on the McCain Road portion of this project. Work will commence on Robinson Road and at the intersection of Robinson/McCain following the end of the 2021-22 school year.

JN 206636 Overlay Project, Territorial Road and Clark Lake Road All-Season Routes

Michigan Paving and Materials will construct this project during the 2022 construction season.

FY 2022

County Farm/Springport Corridor Improvements and Jackson Technology Park – North Construction

Draft final plans were submitted to the EDA in December, and all easements were verbally agreed upon for January approval. Anticipated plan completion will take place following approval of easements, with an anticipated letting in March or April.

Construction:

I-94 & US-127 – Install cameras and/or permanent message boards near Airport Road, Parnall Road, Page Ave, I-94/US-127 south interchange, Hawkins Road, Whipple Road, and Grass Lake Scales. Message boards installed and working on communication connections.

I-94 at Elm Road, Lansing Ave. and West Ave (US-127 west), also includes resurfacing on US-127 (I-94 to Parnall) – Both directions of I-94 are on the new westbound roadway. Traffic will remain in this configuration through the winter, with all ramps open, except the northbound West Ave to WB I-94, which will remain closed thru the winter. The Lansing Ave. bridge opened December 23rd. During the winter months work will continue on the new eastbound roadway, near the Elm Road interchange, and on the detention pond in the northeast quadrant of the West Ave. interchange.

US-127 bridges over M-50/Railroad (just north of McDevitt) – Deck replacement and superstructure repairs. Work is complete for the winter and will resume near March 2022.

Railroad bridges over Jackson Street and Mechanic Street in downtown Jackson – Bridge replacement. Construction scheduled to begin near March 2022. A public meeting is scheduled for February 9th from 2-5:30pm at Christoff and Sons. Short presentations will occur at 2:30 and 5 pm.

I-94 from M-60 to Calhoun County line – Reconstruction from M-60 to Michigan Ave, major rehabilitation from Michigan Ave to Calhoun County line – (2022-2024 construction). Scheduled for a February 2022 letting.

Design:

M-106 and I-94BL – Non-freeway signing upgrade (late 2022 construction).

I-94 Westbound from Mt. Hope Road to Washtenaw County line – Capital preventative maintenance resurfacing (2023 construction)

M-50 from Valley Farm Road to Lincoln Road – Shoulder paving (2023 construction)

Cooper Street (M-106) bridge replacement in downtown Jackson south of train station – Bridge replacement (2024 Construction).

US-127 (Henry to near Ingham Co Line) – state funds only, major resurfacing (future construction).

Subject: Targets for 2022 Safety Performance Measures – Resolution Adoption

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) continues to require that States, MPOs, and operators of public transportation establish targets in specific national performance areas. MPOs may support the state targets for the performance measures and/or establish specific numeric targets on their own. MPOs will not be penalized if MDOT does not meet any of their performance measure targets.

MDOT has been working with MPOs across the state to share information as the targets and timelines are developed. The 2022 safety performance measures are due to MDOT by February 27, 2022. Upon review of the materials from FHWA and MDOT, the **Region 2 Planning Commission staff recommends** that the Region 2 Planning Commission, acting as the MPO, agrees to **support MDOT's Safety Performance Measure Targets for Calendar Year 2022** by passing the attached resolution.

MDOT has provided the following information regarding the Safety Performance Measure:

To meet the safety goal of reducing fatalities and serious injuries on the state trunkline system, MDOT's Safety Program's focus is to select cost-effective safety improvements, as identified in Michigan's Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP), and to address trunkline locations with correctable fatality and serious injury crashes. All proposed safety funded improvements must be supported by the MDOT Region's Toward Zero Deaths (TZD) Implementation Plan to mitigate crashes within the region. Priority is given to the projects within each Region that align with SHSP focus area improvements that have the lowest cost/benefit analysis or are a proven low-cost safety improvement to address the correctable crash pattern. On the local road system, MDOT administers federal safety funds for safety improvements supported by a Local Road Safety Plan or addressed by means of a low-cost safety project. High Risk Rural Roads is one program used to address rural roadways where fatalities and serious injuries exceed the statewide average for that class of roadway.



Region 2 Planning Commission Resolution to Support Michigan Department of Transportation State Targets for Safety Performance Measures

WHEREAS, the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) has established targets for five performance measures based on five year rolling averages for:

1. Number of Fatalities,
2. Rate of Fatalities per 100 million Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT),
3. Number of Serious Injuries,
4. Rate of Serious Injuries per 100 million VMT, and
5. Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Non-Motorized Serious Injuries; and

WHEREAS, the MDOT coordinated the establishment of safety target with the 14 Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) in Michigan through the monthly Target Coordination Meetings and through discussions at various meetings of the Michigan Transportation Planning Association, and

WHEREAS, the MDOT has officially adopted the state safety targets in the Highway Improvement Program annual report dated August 31, 2021, and

WHEREAS, the Region 2 Planning Commission may, within 180 days of the State establishing and reporting its safety targets, establish safety targets by agreeing to plan and program projects so that they contribute toward the accomplishment of the state safety targets, or committing to a quantifiable target for each safety performance measure for their own metropolitan planning area,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Region 2 Planning Commission has agreed to support the MDOT's state safety targets for calendar year 2022, and

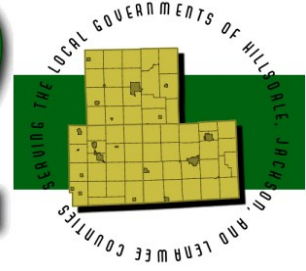
