RE: June JACTS Update

We would like to provide the following update regarding our projects that are on the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2021, 2022, and 2023.

Fiscal Year 2021

STUL (Urban) Federal Aid Projects

JN 207171 McCain Road and Robinson Road

Work has been completed on the McCain Road portion of this project. Work will commence on Robinson Road and at the intersection of Robinson/McCain during mid-July with completion before the new school year begins.

STP Local (Rural) Federal Aid Project

JN 206636 Overlay Project, Territorial Road and Clark Lake Road All-Season Routes

Project is substantially complete. Clean up items remain.

Fiscal Year 2022

STUL (Urban) Federal Aid Projects

JN 207169 South Street Preventive Maintenance

Project was in a June 2022 letting. Bids came back 29.6% over engineer's estimate. Bids were rejected for this project. Changes will be made to the project and placed in a fall letting with a 2023 completion date.

STP Local (Rural) Federal Aid Projects

JN 215587 - Holibaugh Road

This project will place a preventive maintenance wedge and overlay on Holibaugh Road from the north Village of Springport limits to the Eaton/Jackson County line, a distance of 2.6 miles. GI meeting has been held and the final documents for submission are being prepared. Currently waiting on EGLE permit for three culvert replacements in the project.

U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA) Grant Project

County Farm/Springport Corridor Improvements and Jackson Technology Park – North Construction The bid letting was July 7, 2022. Bids came back 30% over engineer's estimate. JCDOT and Blackman Township are looking into possible funding options.

MDOT Local Bridge Program

JN 209883 S. Jackson Bridge Replacement

Project documents have been submitted for a fall letting date. This project completion date has been extended until next year due to bridge construction cost pressures. The bridge project itself will still have stipulations on the amount of time that it can be closed for construction. This project will replace the existing bridge with a precast box culvert.

<u>Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Grant – Shared-use Pathway Project</u> JN 210635 Mike Levine Lakelands Trail Extension

The Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy is requiring hazardous material testing through the Consumers easement. Also working with a property owner to obtain an easement for the path along Lansing Avenue. Once these issues are resolved, a letting date can be determined.

HRRR & HSIP Funding – MDOT Safety Grant Projects

JN 210343 Compact Roundabout at South Dearing Road and McCain Road

JCDOT is finalizing design for a "peanut shaped" roundabout that will fit in the right of way on the northwest corner and require nearly the same square footage of purchased right of way as the previous roundabout design on the other quadrants of the intersection. Project is expected to be in a fall 2022 letting with construction in summer 2023.

JN 211703 Compact Roundabout at Horton Road and Springbrook Road

GI Meeting was held on July 12, 2022. SHPO returned a "More Information Needed" result from the archeological records review due to possible remains of two blacksmiths' shops. This review require shoveling samples in the area of concern and a written report of findings by a qualified archeologist. This report will then be submitted to SHPO for approval if nothing is found. Efforts are being made to still keep the project on track for an FY 2022 obligation, late Fall 2022 letting, and construction in Summer 2023.

JN 211855 Compact Roundabout at Springport Road and Rives Junction Road

GI Meeting was held on June 29, 2022. Currently waiting on an EGLE permit for the 0.23 acres of wetland disturbance. This wetland disturbance will be mitigated through the County Road Association's wetland bank program. Project is expected to be in a fall 2022 letting with construction in summer 2023.

JN 211779 Countywide Horizontal Curve Signing (West and Northeast) – CONSTRUCTION JN 211851 Countywide LED Stop Signs

GI meeting has been held and final documentation is being prepared for final submission.

JN 211779 Countywide Horizontal Curve Signing – DESIGN

JCDOT will obtain vendor bids for this project.

JN 211823 N. Concord Road Tree Removal

JN 211852 Moscow Road Tree Removal

JN 211853 Rives Junction Road Tree Removal

Final documents are being prepared for a late summer letting and winter 2022 construction.

JN 211862 Page Avenue - Road Safety Audit

The Page Avenue RSA will begin sometime in summer 2022.

JN 213736 Edgeline Pavement Markings

Project was in a June letting. Construction will take place in summer 2023.

JN 213875 N. Stony Lake Road, Seymour Road, and Race Road Tree Removal

GI Meeting to be held July 18th. Anticipate a fall 2022 letting.

JN 214064 Horton Road (Ferguson Road to Weatherwax Drive) Road Safety Audit

JN 214065 Moscow Road Intersections Road Safety Audit

These RSAs will be sent out for proposals during late summer. These were sent out earlier this year for proposals, but due to a lack of responses these were not awarded.

JN 214462 Countywide Horizontal Curve Signing (Southeast)

JN 214463 Countywide LED Stop Signs

JN 214464 Countywide High Friction Surface Treatment and LED Stop Signs

A GI meeting is scheduled for July 19, 2022. Anticipated letting late Fall 2022. These three projects were pulled ahead from FY 2023 as a result of the increased safety funding.

Fiscal Year 2023

HRRR & HSIP Funding - MDOT Safety Grant Projects

JN 213879 Dearing Road and Jefferson Tree Removal

JCDOT is developing environmental documents and is beginning design for a summer 2023 letting.

JN 213984 Springport Road and Minard Road Compact Roundabout

JCDOT is developing environmental documents and is beginning design for a summer 2023 letting.

JN 214664 Airport Road at Wayland Drive/Meijer Drive Signal Modernization

JCDOT is developing environmental documents and is beginning design for a summer 2023 letting.



PROJECT REPORT 2020-2023 TIP

July 2022

1. Grants

- a. We are continuing to seek out competitive grant opportunities to fund TIP approved projects.
- b. We are in the process of completing our annual application for formula funding through the FTA. Our application is currently in the "Initial Review/Concurrence" status, which means our FTA program manager has reviewed and approved it.

2. Vehicle Procurements

- a. We have finally received pricing from Gillig for the new buses with options such as, the driver barrier, installation of a bike rack, and the use of the Quantum automated wheelchair securement position instead of the traditional wheelchair restraints. We are now confirming the options requested and ensuring each of the three (3) buses we are having manufactured are configured the same. The approved increase in pricing through the Washington state contract was roughly 11% due to increases in the Producer Price Index (PPI).
- b. We submitted to Hoekstra an order for three (3) new Ford Transit vans. The current wait time for manufacture and delivery of the vehicles is approximately 6-8 months. These vehicles are being procured through a State of Michigan vehicle contract.

3. Bus & Bus Components

a. As previously reported, we are working with the State of Michigan, through MDOT, to procure automated wheelchair securements. This project involves retrofitting six (6) of the city buses in our current active fleet with the new wheelchair securement positions as well as retrofitting the seating to be compatible with the new wheelchair positions. The vendor chosen for this procurement by MDOT is Q'Straint. On April 4th, we submitted the purchase order to get this project in motion. We are currently anticipating receiving the equipment by July 2022.

4. Facility Upgrades

a. We have received the site plans as well as the bidding specifications for a final review from the engineering and architectural firm, Fishbeck, for the concrete replacement project at the downtown Transfer Center. We are in the process of drafting the invitation for bid (IFB).





b. The overhead doors for our maintenance and bus storage facilities are weathered, worn, and becoming cost prohibitive to maintain. I have been able to secure approval from the FTA to reallocate funds from older grants to finance a project to replace these doors throughout our facility. MDOT has approved the updated project. The RFQ has been drafted and reviewed and we are preparing to go out to bid for this project.

Construction:

I-94 & US-127 – Install cameras and/or permanent message boards near Airport Road, Parnall Road, Page Ave, I-94/US-127 south interchange, Hawkins Road, Whipple Road, and Grass Lake Scales. Message boards installed and working on communication connections.

I-94 at Elm Road, Lansing Ave. and West Ave (US-127 west), also includes resurfacing on US-127 (I-94 to Parnall) – Earthwork, concrete paving and storm sewer work is occurring at the Elm Road interchange. Concrete paving has been occurring on EB I-94 near West Ave and on West Ave under I-94. The new entrance ramp to EB I-94 is expected to be open and two lanes have been re-established on West Ave near Boardman. A major traffic switch to EB I-94 is expected within the next few weeks.

I-94 from M-60 to Calhoun County line – Reconstruction from M-60 to Michigan Ave, major rehabilitation from Michigan Ave to Calhoun County line – (2022-2024 construction). Shoulder widening is nearly complete, and traffic is expected to be shifted into a split merge configuration from Michigan Ave to the Calhoun County line. The I-94/Michigan Ave interchange is closed until near September 1st to rebuild the interchange with roundabouts. Single lane closures are occurring Monday morning thru Friday morning.

US-127 bridges over M-50/Railroad (just north of McDevitt) – Deck replacement and superstructure repairs. US-127 is down to one lane in each direction and traffic is on the southbound bridge. Additional deterioration has been found on the northbound bridge and repairs are being made to the piers and beams. The NB 127 entrance ramp from M-50 is closed.

Railroad bridges over Jackson Street and Mechanic Street in downtown Jackson – Bridge replacements. Construction began on March 14, 2022, with Mechanic, Jackson, Detroit, and Van Buren Streets being closed near the project. Work is occurring on the bridge foundations and retaining walls at Jackson Street and Mechanic Street. Due to utility issues, bridge work will also occur in 2023.

Lakelands Trail from near Hawkins to Parnall – Non-motorized trail extension. Most of the aggregate base is placed and surface aggregate being installed.

Annual pavement marking – Countywide state roadways. Work is underway.

Asphalt Crack Sealing – Various state roadways. Work is underway.

Signing upgrade on M-50, I-94 BL (E. Michigan Ave), M-124 - August 2022 letting and work will begin this fall.

Design:

M-106 (Cooper St.) – Signing upgrade from Michigan Ave to M-52– Non-freeway signing upgrade (2023 construction).

I-94 Westbound from Mt. Hope Road to Washtenaw County line – Capital preventative maintenance resurfacing (2023 construction)

Traffic signal modernization on Cooper Street and MLK (Washington, Glick, Ganson, Leroy, Parnall, South, Morrell, & High. MLK at Ganson.) – Late 2023 construction.

M-50 from Valley Farm Road to Lincoln Road – Shoulder paving (2023 construction).

Cooper Street (M-106) bridge replacement in downtown Jackson south of train station and Louis Glick (I-94BL) deck replacement near Mechanic Street – (2024 Construction).

US-127 Freeway Sighing Upgrade (I-94 to Ingham County Line and M-50 to I-94) – (2024 Construction).

US-127 (Henry to near Ingham Co Line) – state funds only, major resurfacing (future construction).

I-94 at Airport Road interchange – Operational study to review alternatives (future construction).
