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## 2021

Steward Street: RR to Ganson (Urban) – Mill and asphalt resurface with curb repairs and signal reconstruction at Ganson. HRC is the consultant on this project. Project was let by MDOT on June 7 with J Ranck as the low bidder. All surface and subsurface work is complete. **Delivery of signal poles and mast arms is scheduled for mid-May.**

Wisner St Traffic Signals (HSIP) Ganson, North and Argyle – Replacement of the existing traffic signals at these three intersections with mast arm signals. HRC is the consultant on this project. All surface and subsurface work is complete. **Signal poles and mast arms are fabricated are in the process of getting painted. Delivery should be in the next several weeks.**

## 2022

E. High Street Bridge over the Grand River – Replacement of the existing bridge superstructure. HRC is the consultant on this project. Contractor is The Beaver Excavating Co. **Shop Drawings review is on schedule for the steel beam delivery about July 5 with work to start mid-May.**

West Avenue Signals at Franklin, Washington and Morrell with Ganson and Elm Signal - Reconstruct Signals on West Ave at Franklin and Morrell with Signal at Ganson and Elm. HRC is the consultant on this project. Contractor is Wright Electric Co. **Preconstruction meeting was held on April 5<sup>th</sup>. Road work cannot start until the water main contract is finished.**

Greenwood Ave: Fourth St to Morrell St with Greenwood/Fourth & Fourth/Prospect Signals - Mill and HMA Resurface on Greenwood with signal replacements at the intersections. HRC is the consultant on this project. Contractor is Michigan Paving and Materials Co. **Preconstruction meeting was held on April 5<sup>th</sup>. Road work cannot start until after the Memorial Day parade on May 31<sup>st</sup>.**

## 2023

Brown Street: Morrell to Michigan – Mill and HMA Relocate curb and construct non-motorized trail on east side. Spaulding DeDecker is the consultant on this project.

Wildwood Avenue: West Ave to Steward – Mill and HMA Resurface. City has sent out Request for Proposals to obtain consultant. Spaulding DeDecker is the consultant on this project.

Crosswalk Enhancements at 5 Locations (HSIP) – Sidewalk ramps, LED bordered signs, along non-motorized paths. HRC is the consultant on this project.

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We would like to provide the following update regarding our projects that are on the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2021, 2022, and 2023.

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## Fiscal Year 2021

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### **STUL (Urban) Federal Aid Projects**

#### **JN 207171 McCain Road and Robinson Road**

Work has been completed on the McCain Road portion of this project. Work will commence on Robinson Road and at the intersection of Robinson/McCain following the end of the 2021-22 school year.

### **STP Local (Rural) Federal Aid Project**

#### **JN 206636 Overlay Project, Territorial Road and Clark Lake Road All-Season Routes**

The preconstruction meeting was held on April 7<sup>th</sup>. The project will begin on April 25<sup>th</sup> with cross culvert replacements. Paving is scheduled to begin the week of May 12<sup>th</sup>. Completion is scheduled for early July.

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## Fiscal Year 2022

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### **STUL (Urban) Federal Aid Projects**

#### **JN 207169 South Street Preventative Maintenance**

Project documents were submitted for an anticipated June 2022 letting.

## **STP Local (Rural) Federal Aid Projects**

### **JN 215587 – Holibaugh Road**

This project will place a preventive maintenance wedge and overlay on Holibaugh Road from the north Village of Springport limits to the Eaton/Jackson County line, a distance of 2.6 miles.

### **JN TBD – Pavement Markings**

Developing environmental documents and beginning design for Fall 2022 letting.

### **JN 206637 – Preventive Maintenance (Various Roads)**

Developing environmental documents and beginning design for Fall 2022 letting.

## **U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA) Grant Project**

### **County Farm/Springport Corridor Improvements and Jackson Technology Park – North Construction**

The Enterprise Group is working with the EDA on title clearance and a covenant for the new park, and the project will be let following completion of these tasks. Anticipated letting in April.

## **MDOT Local Bridge Program**

### **JN 209883 S. Jackson Bridge Replacement**

Project documents have been submitted for a summer letting date. JCDOT has been advised by our bridge design consultant, Great Lakes Engineering Group, and MDOT to extend the completion date until next year. This extended time recommendation is due to the extended time to procure materials and increased bid costs for projects with tight completion date timelines. The bridge project itself will still have stipulations on the amount of time that it can be closed for construction. This project will replace the existing bridge with a precast box culvert.

## **Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Grant – Shared-use Pathway Project**

### **JN 210635 Mike Levine Lakelands Trail Extension**

Project documents will be submitted for letting once ROW issues are resolved – negotiations with Consumers are ongoing due to the presence of contaminated materials in their proposed easement. JCDOT will have an update on this property in April, once the site has been tested.

## **HRRR & HSIP Funding – MDOT Safety Grant Projects**

### **JN 210343 South Dearing Road and McCain Road Compact Roundabout**

This project was moved to FY 2022 due to right of way procurement issues. JCDOT met with the property owners on Friday, March 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022, to hear and address their concerns about the project. At this time, a maximum offer from the county was given to them. A final decision from the property owners to either accept or reject the offer is requested by April 22, 2022. If the offer is rejected, JCDOT will move forward with the alternate design of a peanut roundabout.

### **JN 211703 Roundabout at Horton Road and Springbrook Road**

Property line surveys have been requested from local survey firms. Developing environmental documents and beginning design for a Fall 2022 letting.

**JN 211779 Countywide Horizontal Curve Signing (West and Northeast) – CONSTRUCTION**

**JN 211851 Countywide LED Stop Signs**

NEPA documents have been approved. GI Documents have been submitted and a GI meeting has been requested.

**JN 211779 Countywide Horizontal Curve Signing – DESIGN**

MDOT has determined that this project can proceed following the vendor procurement guidelines. JCDOT will obtain vendor bids for this project. This project will accurately and quickly measure all of the horizontal curves in the county. The slope of the road will be measured through each curve as well as a GPS location of the road. This information will then be used to calculate the speed advisory for each curve and will calculate a GPS location for each warning sign (curve sign, chevrons) required for the curve. This method drastically increases the accuracy of measuring the speed advisory as well as cuts the field driving time by over 75% to measure the curves. This is because each curve only has to be driven 2-4 times, versus 14-16 times using traditional methods. This project will also allow the county to possibly leverage additional safety grant funding to add additional curve signage to curves around the county.

**JN 211852 Moscow Road Tree Removal**

**JN 211853 Rives Junction Road Tree Removal**

Documents were submitted in early March for a GI Meeting, with an anticipated July 2022 letting and Winter 2022 construction.

**JN 211855 Roundabout at Springport Road and Rives Junction Road**

Developing environmental documents and beginning design for a Fall 2022 letting. JCDOT staff met with an adjacent property owner Friday to discuss a possible easement in the NW quadrant of the intersection.

**JN 211862 Page Avenue - Road Safety Audit**

**JN 211864 Spring Arbor Road - Road Safety Audit**

Due to Consultant availability, the Spring Arbor Road RSA will begin in May 2022. The Page Avenue RSA will begin sometime in Spring 2022.

**JN 213736 Edgeline Pavement Markings**

Project documents were submitted for a June letting, with construction taking place in Summer 2023.

**JN 213875 N. Stony Lake Road, Seymour Road, and Race Road Tree Removal**

JCDOT is developing environmental documents and is beginning design for a Summer 2022 letting.

**JN 214064 Horton Road (Ferguson Road to Weatherwax Drive) Road Safety Audit**

**JN 214065 Moscow Road Intersections Road Safety Audit**

A request for proposals was released for the Horton Road/S. Jackson Road RSA in early March; due to a lack of responses, it will be re-released in April. JCDOT will release a request for proposals for the Moscow Road RSA in early 2022.

**Construction:**

**I-94 & US-127** – Install cameras and/or permanent message boards near Airport Road, Parnall Road, Page Ave, I-94/US-127 south interchange, Hawkins Road, Whipple Road, and Grass Lake Scales. Message boards installed and working on communication connections.

**I-94 at Elm Road, Lansing Ave. and West Ave (US-127 west), also includes resurfacing on US-127 (I-94 to Parnall)** – Earthwork temporary paving and storm sewer work is occurring at the Elm Road interchange. The eastbound I-94 bridge deck over West Ave. was poured. Other work that will be starting soon will be on West Ave near I-94 and westbound I-94 near West Ave. soon.

**US-127 bridges over M-50/Railroad (just north of McDevitt)** – Deck replacement and superstructure repairs. US-127 is down to one lane in each direction and traffic is on the southbound bridge. Additional deterioration has been found on the northbound bridge and repairs are being made to the piers and beams. The NB 127 entrance ramp from M-50 is closed.

**Railroad bridges over Jackson Street and Mechanic Street in downtown Jackson** – Bridge replacements. Construction began on March 14, 2022, with Mechanic, Jackson, Detroit, and Van Buren Streets being closed near the project. Work is occurring on the bridge foundations and retaining walls.

**I-94 from M-60 to Calhoun County line** – Reconstruction from M-60 to Michigan Ave, major rehabilitation from Michigan Ave to Calhoun County line – (2022-2024 construction). Construction begins near April 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Lakelands Trail from near Hawkins to Parnall** – Non-motorized trail extension. Tree clearing is underway.

**Design:**

**M-106 and I-94BL** – Non-freeway signing upgrade (late 2022 construction).

**I-94 Westbound from Mt. Hope Road to Washtenaw County line** – Capital preventative maintenance resurfacing (2023 construction)

**M-50 from Valley Farm Road to Lincoln Road** – Shoulder paving (2023 construction)

**Cooper Street (M-106) bridge replacement in downtown Jackson south of train station and Louis Glick (I-94BL) deck replacement near Mechanic Street** – (2024 Construction).

**US-127 (Henry to near Ingham Co Line)** – state funds only, major resurfacing (future construction).

**I-94 at Airport Road interchange** – Operational study to review alternatives (future construction)

# S | S SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL 4 | A (SS4A) FACTSHEET

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## WHAT IS THIS PROGRAM AND ITS GOAL?

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) establishes the new Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) discretionary program that will provide \$5-6 billion in grants over the next five years. Funding supports regional, local, and tribal initiatives through grants to prevent roadway deaths and serious injuries. The SS4A program supports the Department's [National Roadway Safety Strategy](#) and a goal of zero deaths and serious injuries on our nation's roadways.

## WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

- Metropolitan Planning Organizations;
- Counties, cities, towns, and other special districts that are subdivisions of a State;
- Federally recognized Tribal governments; and
- Partnerships comprised of the entities above.

## WHAT KIND OF ACTIVITIES ARE ELIGIBLE?

- Develop or update a "Comprehensive Safety Action Plan" or Action Plan (e.g., Vision Zero plans, etc.).
- Conduct planning, design, and development activities in support of an Action Plan.
- Carry out projects and strategies identified in an Action Plan. Illustrative examples of projects and strategies could include but are not limited to:
  - Improvements along an expanded multimodal network of reconfigured roads with separated bicycle lanes and improved safety features for pedestrian crossings.
  - Low-cost safety treatments such as rumble strips, wider edge lines, flashing beacons, and better signage along high-crash rural corridors.
  - Speed management projects such as traffic calming road design changes and setting appropriate speed limits for all road users.
  - Safer pedestrian crossings, sidewalks, additional lighting, and other safety enhancements for people walking, rolling, or using mobility assistive devices.
  - Address alcohol-impaired driving along key corridors through education, outreach, and publicized sobriety checkpoints on weekends and holidays.
  - Street design changes informed by culturally competent education and community outreach.
  - Creating safe routes to school and public transit services through multiple activities that lead to people safely walking, biking, and rolling in underserved communities.

## WHEN WILL FUNDING BE AVAILABLE?

A Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) is anticipated to be released in Spring of 2022, likely in May. Award announcements are anticipated to be made by the end of 2022 or early 2023.

## WHAT SHOULD I BE PREPARING FOR IN THE MEANTIME?

The development and establishment of an Action Plan is a key component of this program. If interested in applying for funds to develop a new Action Plan, start identifying who your partners will be, such as government stakeholders (e.g., in transportation, planning, health, law enforcement, etc.), private sector entities, and community groups. Consider how to engage community members, specifically those historically underrepresented in transportation decision-making. Applicants seeking funding for projects and strategies identified in an established Action Plan could begin considering which specific activities and projects would address their most pressing roadway safety issues. For potential projects, consider the extent to which additional planning and design is needed, and assess the applicability of laws such as the National Environmental Protection Act or the National Historic Preservation Act.

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R2PC staff has prepared the Jackson Area Comprehensive Transportation Study (JACTS) DRAFT Urban Transportation Unified Work Program (UWP) and budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2023, which begins October 1, 2022 and ends September 30, 2023. The Unified Work Program (UWP) is a financial budgetary document that outlines the expenditures R2PC anticipates to incur and outlines the activities it expects to complete.

The primary focus areas that staff will be working on during FY 2023 include the development of the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP), on-going maintenance of the FY2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), and monitoring of performance measures to gauge project effectiveness. Staff has programmed \$273,263 in Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) funds to complete the tasks outlined in the work program.

The DRAFT JACTS Urban Transportation UWP is available for public comment from April 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022 – May 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022.
